COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Peters Township School Counseling Program promotes and enhances the learning process for all students through an integration of Academic, Personal/Social and Career Development. Key areas of focus include assisting students to acquire the attitudes, knowledge, and skills that contribute to effective learning in school and across the life span.

STUDY SKILLS

- Use effective communication skills to know when and how to ask for help.
- Identify how persistence and effort positively affect learning.
- Use effective coping skills.
- Apply conflict resolution skills.
- Personal goal setting.
- Demonstrate cooperative behavior in a group.

MAJOR UNIT THEMES:

1. ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT

- Develop a broad range of interests.
- Demonstrate effort and persistence.
- Accept mistakes.
- Take responsibility for actions.
- Listen to learn and ask for help.
- Develop confidence to try new things.
- Demonstrate the relationship between interests and future work.
- Understands that balance between many interests, skills, and activities.
- Understand that the value of life-long learning is essential to achieving goals.
- Applying time management and task management is essential to the learning process.

2. PERSONAL/SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

- Recognize, accept, respect, and appreciate individual differences and points of view
- Identify and express feelings and appropriate responses.
- Practice effective communication.

- Learn effective coping skills.
- Learn problem-solving strategies and conflict resolution skills to improve peer relations.
- Realize personal responsibility with regard to social issues and behavior pertaining to bullying
- Show respect for self and others
- Identify situations that may require adult assistance.
- Recognize there are consequences for decisions and choices.

3. CAREER DEVELOPMENT

- Identify traditional and non-traditional occupations.
- Realize individuals have personal skills, interests, and motivations.
- Learn decision making and goal setting skills to make informed career choices.
- Recognize interests may change as an individual develops.
