COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The curriculum is based on literature appreciation and the information literacy skills of selecting resources independently, locating, utilizing, and sharing information. Instruction is organized into units: Library Orientation, Literature Motivation and Appreciation, Access Information, Digital Citizenship, Ethical Use of Information, and Analyze, Identify and Evaluate Resources.

- Knowledge of library use and circulation procedures
- Independent use of Online Public Access Catalog
- Independent use of print and electronic resources
- Self-selection of literature for independent reading
