CORE BODY OF KNOWLEDGE

SOCIAL STUDIES GRADE 4

For each of the sections that follow, students may be required to understand, apply, analyze, evaluate or create the particular concepts being taught.

COURSE DESCRIPTION: In this course, students will define and identify major landforms and river systems in Pennsylvania. Students will define, explain, and analyze how temperature, precipitation, and elevation relate to climate. Students will describe the types of severe weather that affect Pennsylvania, and describe the major natural resources of Pennsylvania. Students will identify the Europeans who explored Pennsylvania, identify Benjamin Franklin's most important inventions, discuss how the frontier was settled, and examine the life of pioneer families. They will describe how a free-enterprise system works, identify some of the major agricultural products of Pennsylvania, and explain the effects of modern technology on farming in Pennsylvania. They will explain the four kinds of local government, and understand the checks and balances system, and identify the three branches of state government. Students will explore the five regions of the United States and learn about each regions landform, history, people, and its resources. Students will create projects based on a given state and will partake in a final project called State Fair.

- Define the terms immigrant, indentured servant and slavery.
- Identify Benjamin Franklin's most important inventions and contributions to colonial life.
- Describe early life in Pennsylvania's farms, and in the city of Philadelphia.
- Note the key role Philadelphia played in our country's early history.
- Identify the role of Ben Franklin's contributions to society in Pennsylvania.
