COURSE SYLLABUS: DIGITAL AUDIO PRODUCTION I

Course Overview and Essential Skills

Digital Audio Production I is an entry level, hands-on course that focusses on beginner to intermediate terminology and application of professional audio engineering. Activities in the course include, but are not limited to, creation and editing of sound effects, recording, and music in areas such as radio, professional musical recordings, movies, and television production.

Course Outline of Material Covered:

Unit or Topic	Concepts/Skills/Resources	Timeframe
Sound Terminology, Software, and Equipment	By beginning with the end in mind, this unit teaches beginner vocabulary that sound technicians use as well as teaching the technical aspect of all of the software that will be needed for projects and future job opportunities. We are proactive in discussing the significance of Film Sound and introduce the integration of music and sound effects into movies.	<u>2 Weeks</u>
Elements of Sound Recording	By synergizing with the entire class, this unit brainstorms ideas of sound recording and the sensitivity of sound editing as it pertains to motion pictures. Students will record many sound effects inside and outside as well as edit those sound in Garageband and/or Protools. They will also prepare a file in Garageband and/or Protools for an upcoming movie trailer project that will be due in the next couple of weeks.	<u>2 Weeks</u>

Sound in Media	By beginning with the end in mind, students will remove all sound elements from a movie trailer and add ADR, musical underscoring, and sound effects to recreate the sound in said movie trailer.	<u>5 Weeks</u>
Story Formation and Structure	Students will be proactive by brainstorming a theme for the radio show, formulating a story, and being part of the audition process for choosing characters for the Radio Show.	<u>1 Week</u>
Recording, Editing, and Mastering	Students will think win-win when they record, search, and/or produce sound effects, dialog, and/or musical underscoring as well as edit, mix, master, and/or export the final show to a wave and mp3 file using the software, Pro Tools. Students will record a Project Timeline that will help keep them on task through the rest of the semester. They will also keep a journal of their work that will be recorded daily.	<u>8 Weeks</u>
