Objectives

- To inform family members, friends, peers, co-workers, staff, and all community members that WE (not Law Enforcement or Government officials) are the keys to prevention of extremist acts of violence, etc.
- To enhance awareness of some basic indicators often exhibited by extremist threat actors and active shooters before they engage in acts of violence and thereby empower community members to IDENTIFY, INTERVENE, and above all, PREVENT individuals from mobilization to violence.

What this is NOT

- This is NOT an effort to cast blame or responsibility for real or perceived lack of action by FBI, law enforcement (LE), or school administration officials
- This is NOT an effort to surreptitiously increase reporting to LE officials (though reporting may be crucial in certain life or limb situations)
- This is NOT a training session on how to prepare for, or what to do, in a critical incident (though can provide such training)
- This is NOT an effort to encourage community members to intervene regardless of the risk to their personal safety and security and the safety of others
- This is NOT a political debate or discussion on gun control or any other related topic or issue

Key Considerations

- No accurate demographic pattern or “Profile” for Violent Extremist or Active Shooter (W/M)
- Community-Based Approach is essential
 - Can’t rely on LE/judicial system to eliminate this threat
 - Leverage community-based mental health crisis services as warranted
- Indicators over Ideology
- Identification  Intervention  Prevention
 - No diagnostic formula
 - Casting doubt  Prevention

Radicalization - Mobilization

Radicalization is a **process** by which an individual or group comes to adopt increasingly extreme political, social, or religious ideals and aspirations that (1) reject or undermine the status quo or (2) reject and/or undermine contemporary ideas and expressions of freedom of choice.

Mobilization refers to the **process** by which individuals act on their extremist beliefs.

Radicalization Factors

Personal/Psychological Factors

- **Individual Needs**
- Individual Desires
- **Identity** (Targeting youth)
 - “Warrior” mentality
- **Life Experiences/Personal Grievances**
 - **REVENGE**

Group Factors

- Group Dynamics
- **Alienation**
- Self-Selection/Echo Chamber Effect
- Friendship/Social Status

Situational/Sociopolitical Factors

- Collective Grievances
- **Real or Perceived Discrimination**
 - Bullying
- External Events

Ideological Factors

- **Moral Justification for Violence (Extremist Narrative)**
- Religious or Ideological Rewards
- Desire for religious change

Radicalization/Mobilization Propaganda

- Consumption and Sharing of Extremist Propaganda and Videos

There are two types of explosives:

First: Outdoor Explosions

Indicators of Extremist Mobilization

- Advanced Extremist Narrative (Defending the innocent)
 - Channeling altruism and activism
 - Dialogue NOT Dispute – Cast Doubt
- Seeking Religious, Political, and/or Social Justification for Violence
 - Often observable via **LEAKAGE**
 - Peers, family, coworkers, clerics – identification and engagement
- Isolation from Family and Friends
- Triggering Event/Life Crisis

Mobilization Indicators



- Praising Past Attacks – Warrior mentality
- Weapons Acquisition/Training (Paramilitary Exercises, Acquisition of Gear and/or Precursors, Simulation Training)
- History of Violence; Fascination with violence
- Stalking behavior
- Communication/Links to Other Extremists



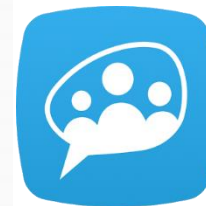

Countering Violent Extremism (CVE)

- Community-Based Approach
 - Parents, Siblings, Peers, Mentors, Coaches, Teachers etc. are the keys to intervention and prevention (not LE)
 - Dialogue & Doubt
- Enhance indicator identification and referral (See something, say something, DO SOMETHING)
 - for safety of ALL **to include the threat actor**

Countering Violent Extremism (CVE)

- Leverage existing support networks - assessment/intervention to discuss/address personal grievances & alienation
