Mrs. Mary Beth Kenny-Massaro is the 7th grade counselor for the 2019-2020 school year. Mrs. Kenny-Massaro is starting her 13th year with the middle school. Prior to working at PTMS, she worked in the Franklin Area School District for 5 years as an elementary counselor. Mrs. Kenny-Massaro earned a B.S. in Psychology from Carlow University, a MSW from the University of Pittsburgh and a School Counseling Certification from Slippery Rock University.

THON

THON is Back!! For several years some very dedicated PTMS staff, led by teachers Stephanie Van Balen, Liz Bladel and Missy Giaquinto, have sponsored a dance-a-thon to earn money for charity.

It is similar to the Penn State THON, just on a smaller scale. THON usually takes place every-other-year, but we weren't able to have it last year. It is back though and bigger than ever!

Students have been challenged to collect \$25,000 for this year's charity—Ronald McDonald House Charities of Pittsburgh and Morgantown, Inc (RMHC).

THON will be held on Friday, January 31, 2020. There will also be several other events and activities prior to that to help raise money.

The first big activity is Friday, October 25th. There will be a scavenger hunt, escape room and a bon fire here at the middle school. Students can come themselves or form a team to compete. There is a \$20 per person cost. Encourage your children to attend this event! They must sign up and pay ahead of time.

Rachel's Legacy of Kindness


Last year, Peters Township School District brought the very powerful Rachel's Challenge Program to us. We spent all year working to help students learn, through ways both big and small, how to reach out to others and spread kindness. As a part of Rachel's Legacy Program, the district is continuing that mission. At each school level that is done in different ways. One of the ways we do this at the middle school is with the continuation of the FOR (Friends of Rachel) Club. Interested students and staff have been meeting in the days and weeks following the Rachel's Legacy Assembly on September 9th to work on some initiatives for the Middle School.

One of the ideas was to "catch" people being kind. If a student or staff member sees someone being kind, they can fill out a "caught being kind" slip and that person will receive a shout out on the morning announcements. There will also be "caught being kind" certificates displayed in the middle school.

Another initiative is a zip-lock bag collection that we will be having during the first week in November. On November, 4th students will hear about Play It Forward, a group which collects new and gently used toys. Play It Forward spends a week sorting toys and then they have a huge shopping day where families in need can "shop" for free for holidays. To facilitate this, Play It Forward is in need of 1 and 2 gallon zip-lock bags to package toys with small pieces. We would like to help this worthy cause, so on Friday, November 8th we are going to ask students to bring in boxes of zip-locks that we can donate to this organization.

The week after Halloween we will also be collecting any leftover or unwanted candy to give to our local Meals on Wheels program. Starting November 1st please send in your candy! We will be collecting candy through November 8th.

Each team of teachers is also challenging their students to show kindness through different activities. So be on the look out for opportunities to support your children in these endeavors.



Hot Shots: After School Homework Help

Hot Shots is an after school homework help program offered to all students who would benefit from a structured homework time facilitated by teachers. This program is homework help, not individual tutoring.

Hot Shots is held every Tuesday and Thursday in the middle school library from 3:00 to 4:00 p.m. Program sponsors for this year are Ms. Collins, Ms. Carto and Mrs. Bernardo-Pankuch. High school National Honor Society students also volunteer their time at the program.

Does your child's assignment book come home blank? Check out the homework online link to find homework assignments updated daily! This link is located on the top right hand corner of the middle school website and also on the counseling page as seen below.

At the top of the homework page you will find the 7th grade teams, followed by the 8th grade teams. You will find the World Language classes listed next and finally you will find an alphabetical listing of all of the special area teachers. So, all you need to know are the names of your child's team and teachers, and then you can look at their homework each day.

The homework page is updated daily with both the nightly homework, as well as long term projects, AR due dates, quizzes and tests.

STAR Team: Student Assistance Program

The Student Assistance Program (STAR Team) is a group process that helps students who are experiencing academic and/or behavioral difficulties that pose a barrier to their learning and success in school.

The STAR Team is comprised of a core group of caring professionals who are trained in student assistance and include: school administrators, teachers, counselors, and community agency liaisons.

The STAR Team gathers information in order to identify concerns, brainstorm solutions, and monitor progress to assist our students. They will make suggestions, implement strategies, and follow up as needed. The goal of the STAR Team is to work with you and other teachers and/or professionals who serve your child to assure his/her success.

All information discussed with the STAR Team is kept strictly confidential. If you think your child could benefit from the STAR Team program or to learn more about it, please contact your child's school counselor.

Safe 2 Say Something

In 2018, the Pennsylvania General Assembly passed Act 44 mandating the establishment and use of the "Safe2Say Something" (S2SS) anonymous reporting system by every Pennsylvania school. Developed in partnership with Sandy Hook Promise, the app will help facilitate the reporting of important safety related information that could help save lives in our schools.

S2SS allows individuals to submit secure and anonymous safety concerns to help identify and intervene when unsafe and/or harmful behaviors take place within K-12 schools statewide.

Through S2SS, students and community members may **ANONYMOUSLY** share safety information through the:

- S2SS app (Safe2SaySomething PA)
- website at https://www.safe2saypa.org/, or
- 24/7 Crisis Center Hotline at 1-844-SAF2SAY (1-844-723-2729).


The tip is then triaged by the Crisis Center to gather enough information and is delivered to the impacted school and, as needed, local law enforcement via 911 County Dispatch. Anonymity is strictly protected unless the person submitting the information wishes to share their identity. If an individual abuses the system or breaks a state or federal law, the District can request a court order to uncover anonymity.



Who Do I Call in the Counseling Department?

Sometimes you may wonder who to call in the School Counseling office when you have a question. Here are some helpful hints so you know who to direct your questions to.

Call Mrs. Cramer if:


- You feel your child needs referred for special education testing.
- You need a work permit for your child.
- You have any questions about extra-curricular activities or sports.
- You have questions about Power School and Power School passwords.



Call your child's grade level school counselor if:

- You feel your child may be having difficulty with an academic or personal/social issue.
- You have questions about scheduling.
- You have questions about high school and post-secondary planning.
- You need assistance finding help outside of school
- You need a list of available tutors.
