MEDICAL MENTORING PROGRAM

Course Overview and Essential Skills

Anatomy & Physiology II/Medical Mentoring Program forms the foundation for coursework in the health-related profession. Students who get accepted into this program will learn how to prepare a resume, research a career, participate professionally in a formal interview, keep a daily work journal, organize a work schedule and develop a portfolio. They will participate in a “complete immersion” experience seeing all the administrative, clerical, maintenance, as well as, clinical aspects associated with their chosen medical field. The students will gain a solid base of information what will give them a glimpse of what the health care profession will be like in the 21st century.
