# **After School Happenings**

**Overview:** These classes are provided as a fun opportunity for McMurray Elementary students to explore interesting topics and hobbies. The program is organized by the PTA and taught by specialists in the listed fields. All instructors, for all *After School Happenings* classes must have PTSD required clearances. This is NOT a fundraising opportunity for the PTA.

<u>Registration Process:</u> All parents must log in to the SignUp Genius website (<a href="http://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0c4ba5aa2ba0fa7-mcmurray5">http://www.signupgenius.com/go/10c0c4ba5aa2ba0fa7-mcmurray5</a>). Proceed to the class you are interested in, and if there is space available, register for the class. Please also sign up to be a parent volunteer at this time. Class Maximums are indicated on the website. Once filled, the class will no longer accept registrations. Please note that parents must be members of the McMurray PTA to register.

# Waivers & payment:

You must print out the waiver(s) (attached to this email), complete and send in with your payment by due date of October 27th. Payment is via CHECK made payable to McMurray PTA.

Due to the popularity of these classes, if payment and waiver(s) are not received by deadline, registration will be voided and your spot will be filled by the next person on the waiting list.

#### Parent Volunteers:

All class dates must have parent volunteer present to facilitate sign in and sign out. This is in lieu of having a volunteer for each individual class. Volunteers are needed to arrive at 3:20 to check in students and 4:15 to start checking students out. All check in \ out is done at the HUB location

If a parent volunteer is not available for classes prior to the start of the class session, then the after school class for that day will be cancelled. In this instance, payments will be refunded to the families for the class cancellation.

The volunteer schedule is sent out to all parents prior to the start of class. If a parent volunteer does not show for the day s/he volunteered, that class will not take place. The instructor will seat the students and call parents to come pick up their child. That class will not be rescheduled nor will refunds be issued in this case. We ask that every effort be made to attend your volunteer day or find a replacement.

#### Notes for Students:

Please send a note to your child's teacher each day that s/he has an after school class. These notes will be collected by the instructor or parent volunteer for the class.

#### Dismissal:

- You must come in to the school to pick up your child. You will sign your child out on a sign-out form and they will be released to you.
- If your child is riding home with a person other than the parent/guardian, please send in a note with your child stating this & include the individual's full name.
- If your child will be walking after the class is finished, please send in a "Student Walker Form" found on the McMurray website, allowing your child to walk after the program. The instructor will escort all "walkers" to the school exit after all other students have been picked up.
- If your child goes to EDS after the class, please send in a note stating this.
   EDS students will be escorted to EDS by the parent volunteer or instructor after class.

# Make Up Classes:

If a class is cancelled due to weather or inclement weather, the instructors will contact you individually regarding make up classes.

# Class Descriptions:
