contributed to efforts to address this problem in our school-community. Our comprehensive approach has been and continues to include the goals of (1) raising awareness, (2) helping students to recognize and understand bullying behaviors, (3) develop strategies to counteract the problem and (4) work to create a social culture that communicates that such destructive and offensive actions and attitudes are not acceptable.

Efforts to accomplish the aforementioned goals have included community programs, classroom and school lessons and assemblies, individual and small group counseling and other educational approaches ranging from the traditional to novel (e.g. the music/work of No Tune Left Behind). Recently, the Peters Township School District adopted a policy against bullying that provides additional support and commitment to prevent and effectively respond to bullying when it occurs.

Alleged bullying situations and reports can be very difficult for students, parents and school personnel to discern and correct. They are sometimes veiled in disputes and disagreements among a wide array of poor or undesirable behaviors. It takes considerable time and commitment to address and assess reports fairly and effectively. Our efforts, while sometimes frustrating, are not in vain. Helping a student who is truly in need is not only morally correct, it is the collective obligation of the school and community.

We, the parents, students and entire educational community, should continue our collective efforts to address this problem for three important reasons:

The well-being of our youth, school climate and community culture. It is a critical component to school climate and simply the "right thing to do." Addressing bullying behaviors affords us the opportunity to teach and reinforce pro-social behaviors and skills required in a civil and just society.

No parent wants his or her child to be a bully or a victim. No child wants to be victimized by bullying. Let's hope and do our part to ensure that the noticeable trend to maintain bullying as a part of the national consciousness continues. Bullying may always exist to some extent given our imperfect nature. But, this is an issue that warrants our attention and action so that we might prevent and rescue our children from being hurt. Children have the right to feel safe and we have the obligation to work to protect them. It's the right thing to do. It's
