At McMurray Elementary School, we are keeping a reflective eye on the past as we continue to honor over fifteen years of accomplishments achieved at our school. The new McMurray Elementary School first received students at the start of the 1993-94 school year under the leadership of Ms. Toni Sulkowski, the school district's current Director of Technology. I felt privileged on the first day of school this tenth year to tell our students that we want them to develop strong minds and soft hearts in the established tradition so that they are prepared to lead, serve and contribute today and throughout their lives.

Principals remarks continued.....

Our focus on the present includes responding to the challenges of designing and implementing a relevant, useful and exciting curriculum for the students of the first decade of this century. The implementation of world language classes for 6th graders began last year, and the program continues to grow as we will begin offering Spanish to fourth grade students next year. Our teachers are reviewing and, in some cases, piloting new language arts materials as we work towards revising curriculum in this area for next school year. A new initiative in writing is underway as our teachers in fourth and fifth grades begin implementation of the use of the 6 Traits Writing Process and the Write to Learn Writing Software. Our students continue to use Investigations in Math along with traditional resources in order to prepare them for the future. Our teachers and students continue to use a variety of technology and access the many resources available in our library to enhance their learning experiences. These and other changes, such as our New master schedule, show how we are focusing on the present and working towards excellence.

There is a bright future on the horizon for McMurray Elementary School and the Peters Township School District as we face the challenges of preparing our students for an exciting and ever-changing world. We currently have thirty-nine classrooms in use by 1,014 students. There are thirteen teachers at each grade level, and we offer a wide-variety of special area classes including music, art, health and physical education, library and special education services. We are planning ways to accommodated for the needs of our students as our student population and programs grow, and we will need to be creative and resourceful in our planning. Two ways that we have already responded to this need include the conversion of one stationary computer lab to a classroom and the modification of library space so that the library classroom can be utilized as a regular classroom. The stationary computer lab has been replaced by a mobile lab of computers.

We envision a future of children increasingly using technology in every classroom and teachers instructing, facilitating and guiding their learning in new and varied ways. Our students will study and prepare for careers that don't even exist today. We will be working hard to prepare them to gain the knowledge and skills they will need to explore, compete, serve, and thrive in a diverse and expanding marketplace.

The educational experience at McMurray Elementary sounds as exciting as it is challenging as we lead into the next decade and beyond. Our purpose and journey will remain grounded in the foundational truths that reside in the words of former President Theodore Roosevelt: "To educate a person in mind, but not morals is to educate a menace to society." The spirit and mission implicit in our school motto will remain. A Good Mind and a Good Heart Always Make a Great Combination. Thank you for your support, encouragement and partnership.
