COURSE SYLLABUS: CONCERT CHOIR

Course Overview and Essential Skills

Concert Choir is an intermediate level choir for any student regardless of ability. Student musicians focus on developing tone production, articulation, phrasing, genre approaches, and musical public performance in a collaborative ensemble.

The focus of the course is geared towards individual/group musical performance. Students apply learned concepts and intermediate techniques to execute higher level difficulty choral literature.

Course Outline of Material Covered:

Tone Production Intonation	Embouchure and air support via oral cavity, lips, jaw, and diaphragm support Use of piano	4 weeks
Rhythm, Diction, and Expression Development	Meter, beat, IPA, lyrical meaning Use of Movement Use of piano	6 weeks
Articulation and Dynamics	Staccato, legato, slur - all addressed through appropriate air support Volume spectrum from <i>pp</i> through <i>ff</i> Dynamic production assisted by air support, energy	6 weeks
Ensemble Literature Music Vocabulary	Application of previous concepts applied to literature performance Appropriate genre interpretation Musical terms applied towards performance expression	20 weeks
