- ALICE training discussed. Training done with students. Recent training was lockdown, barricade, and discussion. Staff entirely trained. Created a student video available on PTSD website. We are considering practicing unstructured evacuation. Other schools are asking us about our ALICE program and we are giving them consultations. Training with students will be refreshed throughout the school year.
