SUPERINTENDENT’S COMMENTS

- Celebration of Excellence
- **Excellence in Academics**
- **Digital Authors At The High School** - The Honors 10 English team at the High School came up with a creative, project-based assessment for the end of our Myths and Folktales unit. Students had to collaborate in groups to create a fairytale/folktale using conventions of that genre. They then used an online program called Book Creator to facilitate the collaboration, writing the narratives and creating illustrations to go along with their stories. As a final step, they recorded a voice-over in Canvas Studio and presented their stories in class.
- **National Aviary Assembly for 6th Grade** - PTMS 6th graders attended an assembly this month with visitors from the National Aviary. Students learned about diverse habitats and how birds adapt to thrive in their environments. Special guests included Mac, a Military Macaw, and Dumbeldore, a Eurasian Eagle Owl.
- **Apple Crunch Day At Bower Hill** – This month marked the celebration of Apple Crunch Day at Bower Hill - marking the statewide celebration of healthy snacks. Students wore apple colored clothes and brought in apple snacks. Second graders in Mrs. Willkomm's class also learned about American folktales and Tall Tales today as part of their American Culture unit. What did they read? Johnny Appleseed, of course!
- **South Hills Trade And Technical Show** – Peters Township High School hosted the second annual Trade and Technical Show on November 1st. Students from the region were invited to stop by and learn more about the trades, technical schools and other post-secondary options that are available.
- **Bower Hill Artists** - Bower Hill artists in grades 1, 2, and 3 have been busy as BEES exploring the process of printmaking! Projects included: stamping with found objects, radial symmetry, and cityscape designs.

- **City Theater Festival** – High School Theatre 1 students had a blast at the Young Playwright’s Festival at the Pittsburgh City Theatre! They got to enjoy three one act plays written by local high school students and acted by professional Pittsburgh actors of the stage and screen. The event featured a surprise bonus when PT theater alumni Mason Dowd was a featured actor in the productions.
- **WACTC Student Earns SkillsUSA Honors** – High School senior and Western Area Career and Technology student Emma Raffael has been named the SkillsUSA Student of the Year for the Western Region. AS part of the Cosmetology program at WACTC, Emma was a Skills USA Pennsylvania State officer during the 2021/2022 school year. She has attended and served at the Pennsylvania Skills USA State Conference, has led a state initiative that supplied donations to the Ronald McDonald house, and she continues to lead the students at the WACTC through her advancement and training in the cosmetology program and Skills USA.
- **Maker Space Sculptures** - Fifth graders in Mrs. Pendergast's class visited the maker space to create sculptures last month. The students used flashlights to trace their sculpture's shadow for a guessing game activity and then discovered ways to change and create shadows in the process!
- **Space Maps At McMurray** - Representatives from our region visited the Intermediate Unit 1 location in McMurray to learn more about new science initiatives through their partnership with the Aldrin Family Foundation, established by astronaut Buzz Aldrin. Students from McMurray Elementary took part in the presentation and demonstrated the new interactive moon maps that can be purchased through the Partnership. This partnership promotes educational tools to engages students in an interactive classroom experience.
- **Suspense Authors At PTMS** – To help get into the Halloween spirit, PTMS 8th graders wrote suspense stories and read them in class. Students voted on the best stories and winners received a “great pumpkin” award.
- **50S Day At Bower Hill** – This month 3rd grade students at Bower Hill celebrated 50s Day to mark the 50th day of school. Students read popular stories from that era and played with toys popular with children in the 50s. On the day of the celebration, students dressed in classic 50s style and took part in activities throughout the day including 50s bingo, learning about the president on the \$50 bill and they even had a root beer float!
- **First Grade Turkey Project** - First Grade Students at Pleasant Valley completed a “hide the turkey” family project by disguising their turkeys with costumes related to something their families like to do! We read stories about turkeys, wrote about their turkey, and the students shared their turkey and the meaning behind the decorations.
