If interested, you can talk to Melissa Konggaard to learn more about the committee.</li> <li>After School Dance: Note that there are two chair people at McMurray that support this as well, so this position would be a liaison to work with those two McMurray chairs.</li> <li>Area Council Representative: looking for BH representative to attend monthly meetings.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Reach out to Karen Lingis and let her know if you are interested. Guest Speaker	<ul> <li>Guest Speaker: Paul Lauer, Peters Township Manager attended the meeting to discuss upcoming plans for Rolling Hills Park.</li> <li>Presented the details for the Proposed Rolling Hills Park. Provided a layout of the proposed park plans. Some points of interest included: <ul> <li>High School is expected to be completed by end of 2020.</li> <li>Park will incorporate recreational facilities not found in other Peters Township parks (e.g. Peterswood Park sports fields).</li> <li>Park plan will include a Community Aquatics Facility.</li> <li>Access to Arrowhead Trail will be incorporated.</li> <li>The Park will be divided into "sections/areas"</li> <li>North Valley; devoted to nature center, sledding hill with warming station at the bottom, nature play area, mountain bike routes/bike agility route. Won't see typical playground structures, more nature type stuff.</li> <li>South Valley; Adventure Play Area and Dog Park, Picnic Park &amp; Pavilions,</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

0	<ul> <li>(3) Ridge Top: The Great Lawn (expansive grass area for play) with picnic areas around it. Picnic Lodge – super sized pavilion capable of holding 100's of people for an event.</li> <li>(4) Court Games – tennis center outdoor court, paddle ball, pickle ball, bocce courts. And Indoor tennis and Deck Hockey court, basketball courts.</li> <li>Aquatics Facility – intended for a broad age group. Including a spray park/wet playground. three pools (lap pool, zero depth pool with fun features, big pool with fun features like a rock climbing wall).</li> </ul>
0	Entire project would cost \$28M.
0	Park is 90 acres in total.
0	Implementation will take several years to build and will be dependent upon financing.
0	Looking for financial assistance/support to fund it.
