SAT

- **Cancelled-** May 2, 2020, SAT and SAT Subject Test administration
- **Cancelled-** Makeup exams for the March 14 administration (scheduled for March 28)
- Students who already registered for May, whose March test centers were closed, or who do not receive March scores because of any irregularities will receive refunds.
- **Next Opportunity for SAT-** first weekend of June. We're working with test centers and we'll decide whether we can safely hold that administration as soon as it's feasible, given the evolving public health situation.

2020 AP Exam Updates

- For the 2019-2020 exam administration only, students can take a 45 minute online exam at home. Traditional face to face exams will not occur.
- Exams will be given from May 11-22
- Makeup test dates will be available for each subject from June 1-5
- We will have online review sessions available for students, both live and on demand.
- This year's AP Exams will not include the final units of the course – units typically covered in March and April.
- While we encourage students to wait until closer to the test date to decide, any student already registered for the exam can choose to cancel at no charge.
- We recognize that the digital divide could prevent some students from participating. Working with partners, we're investing so these students have the tools and connectivity they need to review AP content online and take the exam. If you have students that need mobile tools or connectivity, you can contact us directly to let us know by April 24th.

2020 AP Exam Schedule

Exams will be taken as the same time worldwide.

- For most subjects, the exams will be 45 minutes long, plus an additional 5 minutes for uploading. Students will need to access the online testing system 30 minutes early to get set up.
- Certain courses will use portfolio submissions and will not have a separate online exam. All deadlines have been extended to May 26th.
- Students taking world languages and culture exams will complete two spoken tasks. Written responses will not be required.

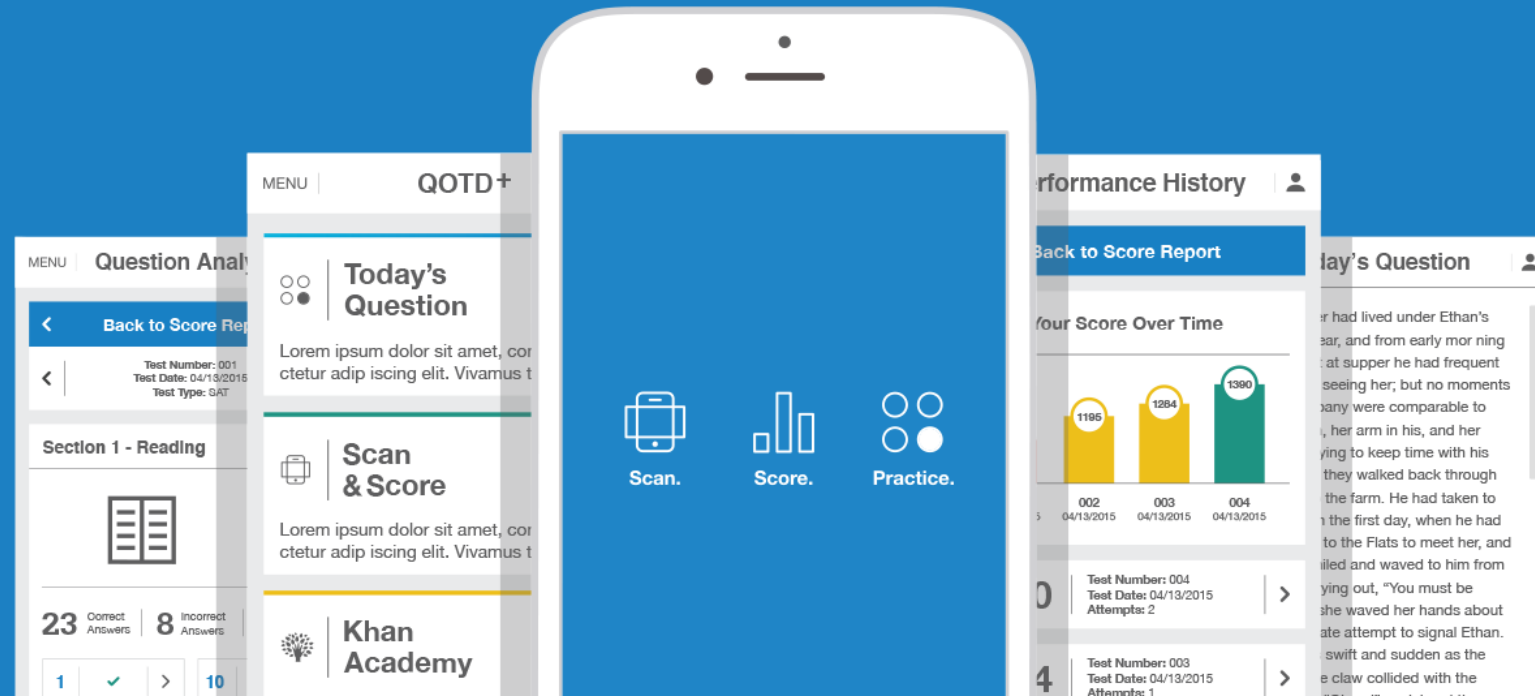
