

Holt-McDougal Textbook: Tutorial

Step 1:

Visit my.hrw.com

PC: Internet Explorer or Firefox

Mac: Safari or Firefox

Step 2:

Fill in your USERNAME and PASSWORD

Username:

22lastnamefirstname

Example: 22lincolnbraham

Password: **your 9-digit student ID numberMS**

Example: 983795790ms



Step 3:

Click the blue **“LOG IN”** button.

Once you log in, you will see two social studies textbooks. (You may or may not have a math textbook)

For the Canada portion of our study, you will use “THE AMERICAS” textbook.

For the United States portion of our study, you will use “UNITED STATES HISTORY” textbook.



Step 4:

Click **“Go to the Online Textbook”** next to the book you want.

Step 5:

Use the two drop down menus at the top of the page to SELECT A UNIT OR CHAPTER and SELECT A SECTION.

Example: Chapter 8 - Canada

Section: Section 1 - Physical Geography

Click the red **“Go!”** button



Step 7:

Textbook pages should appear.

Note: If pages do not appear, you may need to update your plug ins. Return to Step 5 and refer to the “Plug Ins” box.

To change pages, use the PREVIOUS and NEXT buttons.
