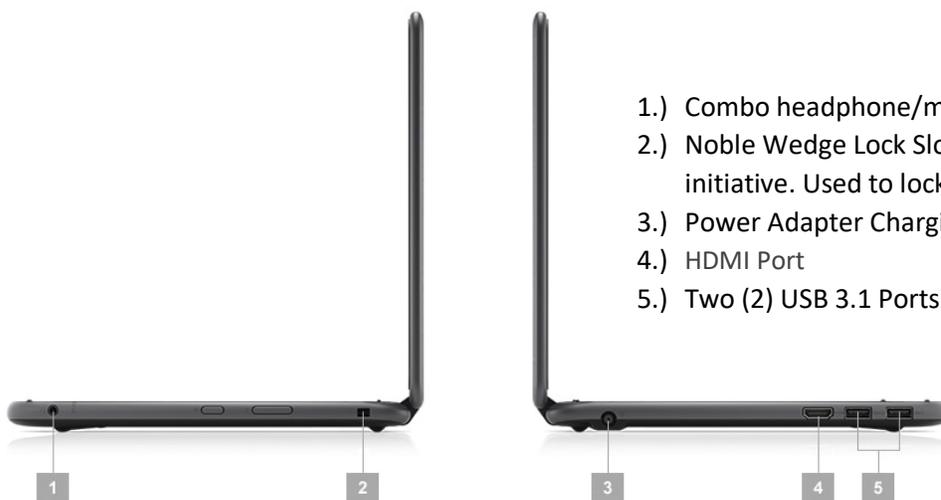

Internet Filtering
