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About Our Community

Peters Township is located approximately 15 miles south of Pittsburgh in the northeastern corner of Washington County. A professional bedroom community of Pittsburgh, this 19.5 square mile township maintains a rich sense of tradition in its transition from a rural, farm community to a suburban, upper-middle class neighborhood. We serve a population of more than 21,400 with over 7,500 households.

Curriculum

Peters Township High School offers a challenging curriculum to meet the needs of all students. We offer:

- 21 Advanced Placement (AP) Courses: English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics C Mechanics/E&M, Physics I: Algebra Based, Environmental Science, U.S. History, U.S. Government and Politics, European History, Economics, Psychology, Spanish, French, German, Music Theory, Computer Science A, and Computer Science Principles.
- Honors level courses are offered in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies starting in the 9th grade. Honors courses are also available in the Fine Arts, Business and Computer Information Technology, and World Language (level IV).
- Career and technical education courses through our partnership with the Western Area Career and Technology Center. Students may choose from options that include: Auto Mechanics, Automation Robotics Engineering Technology, Carpentry, Collision Repair Technology, Cosmetology, Culinary Arts, Electrical Occupations, Rehabilitation Aide/ Sports Medicine, Health Assistant, Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC), Machine Shop, Masonry, Networking, and Welding
- College level courses are offered in partnership with the University of Pittsburgh, Carlow University, and the Community College of Beaver County (CCBC). Students can enroll in College in the High School (CHS) courses offered in the Business, Computers, Information and Technology Department and the Science Department. Students also can enroll in CCBC High School Academies and earn up to 28 college credits. The CCBC High School Academies provides in-person and virtual curriculum in Aviation, Criminal Justice, Education, Heath, and STEM pathways. Students enrolled in CHS courses and the dual enrollment CCBC High School Academies courses earn AP weighted credit.



About Our School District

Each day, we welcome more than 3,900 students to School in Peters Township. Success in our school is measured not only by our stringent academic standards, but by our character as well. Pleasant Valley Elementary School and Peters Township Middle School have been recognized as **National Blue Ribbon Schools** by the U.S. Department of Education and the District received the distinction of being named a National School District of Character by the Character Education Partnership.

In their 2023 Annual Guide to Schools, the Pittsburgh Business Times has ranked Peters Township 3rd in our region and 6th overall across the state. The regional ranking includes the seven counties in Southwestern PA and the statewide ranking includes the nearly 500 districts across Pennsylvania.

Additional PTHS Highlights:

- The Class of 2023 included three **National Merit Finalists** and 11 **National Merit Commended Students**, and 40 students who graduated as PT Scholars with a grade point average of 5.0 or above. Overall, the Class of 2023 earned \$4 million in scholarships.
- Last year, 196 students earned AP Scholar Awards for their performance on Advanced Placement Exams. Additionally, 87 students earned the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.
- Our schools are consistently recognized among the best in the region and across the state. U.S. News and World Report named PTHS the best high school in the region in 2022. At the elementary level, U.S. News ranked Bower Hill Elementary 2nd in PA, with Pleasant Valley Elementary ranking 3rd.

COVID-19 Update: Throughout the 2020-2021 school year, Peters Township offered both 5 day in-person and remote learning options for our students. Remote education provided synchronous instruction for approximately 20% of our student body in the core classes of math, science, English, and social studies, and asynchronous learning for elective offerings. During times of substantial levels of transmission, the PA Department of Health recommended the high school close on four separate occasions for a total of 42 instructional days. Remote learning with synchronous instruction in all courses continued for our students during building closures. Grading procedures remained the same throughout the school year and the District maintained the same rigorous curriculum for all students.
