

### Oral Reading Fluency

Orangutans live in the rain forests of Sumatra and Borneo. They are islands in southeast Asia. 16 Orangutans sleep in nests made from crumpled 23 leaves and branches. 26 In 1971, Biruté went to Borneo to study orangutans. 35 At that time, little was known about these apes. 44 She set up camp in two small huts in the forest. 55 She called it Camp Leakey. 60 Biruté observed baby orangutans, cradled in 66 their mothers' arms. When they are first born, baby 75 orangutans cling to their mothers' raggedy, orange fur. 83 Before long they begin to climb and play. Mothers care 93 for their young until they are about nine-years-old. 103 Young orangutans learn from their mothers which 110 foods are good to eat. Biruté learned that orangutans 119 will eat over four hundred different types of food, such 129 as fruit, leaves, and insects. She has even tried some 139 of this food herself! 143
